Varsity Gridders Win Rutgers Cup; First Perfect Season Since 1942

The Hicksville High School Varsity Football Team climaxed a perfect season by capturing The Rutgers Cup, sympolic of football supremacy in Nassau County. The unblemished record, Hicksville's first since 1942, was the only spotless mark on the North Shore and was equalled only by South Shore I Champion, Roosevelt.

The offense was a major reason for Hicksville's perfect record. Sparked by the passing heroics of quarterback Jeff Doolittle, who threw a phenomenal 20 touchdown passes, Hicksville scored from all parts of the field. Doolittle's favorite target was his end Mike Masciello who repeatedly amazed Comet fans with unbclievable catches. Bob Heartt, the other offensive end, also combined frequently with Doolitte to give Hicksville the best passing offense in the county. The Comet's fine running game featuring junior Ron Carmen complemented Doolittle's aerial acrobatics and gave Hicksville a truly versatile offense. Throughout the year the Comets even showed the option pass (Continued on page six)

thrown by halfback Jim Cara.

The tenacious Hicksville defense was also a major factor in the Comet success story. Not only was the defense virtually impenetrable allowing a meager 51 points the entire season, but it also frequently set up the offense with numerous fumble recoveries and pass interceptions. Among the unsung heroes of the defence were linebackers Herb Bragg and Carl Campletano, and lineman Rick Kramer.

The award of the Rutgers Cup represents as high an achievement as a

Both ends of Hicksville High Schools great passing combination were rewarded for their efforts by being named to the All-Long Island Football Team. The selections of quarterback Jeff Doolittle and end Mike Masciello represent only the second time two players from the same high school were chosen for the honor. Both also finished high in the voting for the Thorpe Award, Newsday's award to the outstanding football player in Nassau County.

Doolittle threw an amazing 20 touch-

down passes in the eight Comet games. He showed remarkable poise and accuracy in completing almost 70% of his passes.

Masciello was outstanding in all of the Comet games, Often double-teamed, be was among the scoring leaders in Nassau County.

Other Comet standouts who were honored were middle guard Herb Bragg and end Bob Heartt, both of whom were named to the All-North Shore

Comet Booters Finish 8-0-4; Cop Third Place in Counties

The Hicksville High booters finished this season with an unprecedented league record of 8 wins, 4 ties, and no defeats, The Comets chalked up 6 straight shutouts to complete the team's first undefeated campaign.

Hicksville came back from a scoreless tie with Plainedge to rout Island Trees 6-0 at home on Oct. 25. Bertram scored twice while Paesani, Squire, Hortian, and Cain also managed to rip the cords.

In a big game against MacArthur on the Generals home field Bertram scored in the first quarter with an assist by Cain. In the last period Saman made a tremendous save and kicked the ball downfield where Rosenzweig booted in the clincher.

Hicksville clinched a tie for the Division by tying Syosset in hard fought contest at Hicksville. On. Nov. 1, the Comets, needing a tie or a win to take the League, met Farmingdale away. The game was again scoreless although the opposition tried to force overtime play in complete darkness.

In the finals of the North Shore Hicksville met Glen Cove which was 16-0 at the time. Hicksville scored first in the third period, but the Covers rallied with a penalty kick and a field goal in the same period to win the wellplayed contest.

In a consolation game Hicksville beat South Side 2-1 on early scores by halfback Germann and inside Roseozweig to cop third place in the counties.

The Counts placed Gary Bertram, Frank Lotti and Rollin McClain on the All-Division. Bertram was second team North Shore while McClain was All-North Shore and All-County.

Cross Country Team Wins North Shore; Takes Second in County Championships

The cross country team has just completed its most successful season. Although they took second place in the North Shore Division I League, they were the North Shore Champs, won the Bethpage Invitational Meet and finished second in the county championships. They were beaten only by Sewanhaka High, a team that has dominated Nassau county long distance running in recent years.

The Comets were outstanding in every meet they ran as they made a total team effort. This past year, they lost the superb running of Tom Scanlon and Ron Morvillo, two of the best cross

country men in Nassau county and in New York State. The Comets were led by five good runners this season. They are Bob McEnany, a Junior, Senior Russ and Rick Hardmeyer and Juniors Dave Blair and Craig Ibbetson. Rick Hardmeyer finished 11th in the County Championships and in doing this, set a new school record for the 2.5 mile course at Salisbury Park with a time of 12 minutes 43 seconds.

The Comets had their best season this year. With many fine Juniors returning, they should have an even better season next year.
